SREE SREE DENA BHAGATH SEVATRUST is an nonprofit organization that currently exists under the laws of the <u>INDIAN TRUST ACT</u>. It was established in <u>2015</u> and was founded by Shree Dena Bhagath, who was a former social work.

The Owner, who has also volunteered for several charities, believes that several children in the city were unable to attain basic educational rights, not out of choice but because their parents simply has no means to earn money to pay for their children's tuition. In a study conducted in 2020, out of 1200 families living within the area, only a handful of few children were able to complete their basic education. Several students who were able to complete their basic education were able to find jobs and relatively improve their lives for the better while simultaneously supporting their families.

However, what remains is that the margin for that is still slim.

SREE SREE DENA BHAGATH SEVATRUST main mission and vision is to widen the narrow margin. To provide education opportunities for children below legal age in order to give them the necessary tools and resources to grow into people with bright minds and have a brighter future. SREE SREE DENA BHAGATH SEVATRUST truly believes that education is a fundamental human right and that every child, regardless of background, deserves a chance to enhance their knowledge of the world.


